CRIMINAL COMPLAINT (CONTINUATION PAGE)

§61-5-17. Obstructing officer; fleeing from officer; making false statements to officer; interfering with emergency communications; penalties; definitions.

~~(a) A person who by threats, menaces, acts, or otherwise forcibly or illegally hinders, or obstructs or attempts to hinder or obstruct a law-enforcement officer, probation officer, parole officer, courthouse security officer, correctional officer, the State Fire Marshal, or a full-time deputy or assistant fire marshal acting in his or her official capacity is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 or confined in jail not more than one year, or both fined and confined.~~

On 7-18-2025 at approximately 0922 hours I arrived at the intersection of Locust Avenue and N Chesnut St for a welfare check. Upon my arrival the defendant was laying on the side walk acting irate and showing multiple signs of impairment. Myself and Sgr Shingleton with the Harrison County Sherrifs Office, attempted to put the defendant in the back of my cruiser so that he could sit until EMS arrived to check him out. We attempted to detain him for the safety of the surrouding citizens and officers due to his irate and erratic behavior. The defenadant locked his arms together infront of him and refused to place his hands behind his back. The defendant was then assisted to the ground by multiple officers where he continued to resist until he was eventually placed in handcuffs. During the entire interaction with the defendant he continued to be combative and even when he was placed in handuffs he did not want to get into the back of my cruiser. In order to get the defendant into my cruiser I had to go around to the other side and pull him in due to him not complying when multiple officers told him to sit in the cruiser.
